





Dear Ms. Wright-Baker:

The Arizona Board of Behavioral Health Examiners ("Board") determined that you are not eligible for licensure pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3275(6). Specifically, the Board found that you engaged in conduct that had you been licensed would have constituted grounds for disciplinary action. The Board determined that the disciplinary action invoked the following violations that were based upon the conduct referenced thereafter:

1. A.R.S. § 32-3251(12)(I), any conduct, practice or condition that impairs the ability of the licensee to safely and competently practice the licensee's profession.

This violation was based on the following findings:

1. In 12/10, you were prescribed medication following surgery and migraines.
2. You were also prescribed anti-anxiety medication following surgery.
3. You indicated you regularly requested early refills of both prescriptions, and began seeking the medication from sources other than your doctor.
4. In your 01/11 intake with your psychiatrist, you indicated:
 - a. You needed help managing your medication
 - b. You have a history of overusing alcohol
 - c. You have a history of misusing medication
5. In 07/12, you were arrested for shoplifting.
6. In 09/12, you were terminated from your employer as a result of your arrest.
7. In 11/12, you were again arrested for shoplifting.
8. On 05/07/15, the Board offered you a consent agreement for the issuance of your license pending the passage of the required exam.
9. On 07/27/15, upon receipt of your signed acceptance of the consent agreement, you were provided written authorization to take the required exam.
10. You were required to take and pass the exam by 08/01/16 and you failed to do so.

In addition, pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3293(2), the Board determined that you did not establish that you qualify for licensure based on the following:

1. You did not establish that you passed an examination approved by the Board.

Per A.R.S. §41.1092.03.B, you may request a Formal Hearing by notifying the agency in writing within thirty-five (35) days from the date of this letter. If you do request a Formal Hearing, you also have the right, pursuant to A.R.S. §41-1092.06, to request a settlement conference. If you do not request a Formal Hearing by the close of business on September 29, 2016 your file will be closed without further recourse to appeal and the licensure denial will be reported to the federal data banks that record this information. If you desire licensure at a later date, you must submit a new application and fee.

PLEASE BE FURTHER ADVISED that, pursuant to the Board's new licensure statute, as of July 1, 2004, only persons holding licenses to practice clinical social work may do so unless they are exempt from licensure pursuant to A.R.S. §32-3271.
