CONSENT AGREEMENT

RESPONDENT

In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of the above captioned matter, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements and responsibilities of the Arizona State Board of Behavioral Health Examiners ("Board"), and pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-3281(F) and 41-1092.07(F)(5), Anabel Aguayo ("Respondent") and the Board enter into this Consent Agreement, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order ("Consent Agreement") as a final disposition of this matter.

RECITALS

Respondent understands and agrees that:

- Any record prepared in this matter, all investigative materials prepared or received by the Board concerning the allegations, and all related materials and exhibits may be retained in the Board's file pertaining to this matter.
- 2. Respondent has the right to a formal administrative hearing at which Respondent can present evidence and cross examine the State's witnesses. Respondent hereby irrevocably waives their right to such formal hearing concerning these allegations and irrevocably waives their right to any rehearing or judicial review relating to the allegations contained in this Consent Agreement.
- 3. Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Consent Agreement.

- 4. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon signing this Consent Agreement and returning it to the Board's Executive Director, Respondent may not revoke their acceptance of this Consent Agreement or make any modifications to it. Any modification of this original document is ineffective and void unless mutually approved by the parties in writing.
- 5. The findings contained in the Findings of Fact portion of this Consent Agreement are conclusive evidence of the facts stated herein between only Respondent and the Board for the final disposition of this matter and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.
- 6. This Consent Agreement is subject to the Board's approval, and will be effective only when the Board accepts it. In the event the Board in its discretion does not approve this Consent Agreement, this Consent Agreement is withdrawn and shall be of no evidentiary value, nor shall it be relied upon or introduced in any disciplinary action by any party hereto, except that Respondent agrees that should the Board reject this Consent Agreement and this case proceeds to hearing, Respondent shall assert no claim that the Board was prejudiced by its review and discussion of this document or of any records relating thereto.
- 7. Respondent understands that once the Board approves and signs this Consent Agreement, it is a public record that may be publicly disseminated as a formal action of the Board, and that it shall be reported as required by law to the National Practitioner Data Bank.
- 8. Respondent further understands that any violation of this Consent Agreement constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3251(16)(n) and may result in disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3281.
- 9. The Board therefore retains jurisdiction over Respondent and may initiate disciplinary action against Respondent if it determines that they have failed to comply with the terms of this Consent Agreement or of the practice act.

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The Board issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Respondent is the holder of License No. LCSW-17004 for the practice of social work in Arizona.
- 2. From 01/18 04/19, Respondent worked for a behavioral health agency ("Agency").
- 3. Respondent and a client ("Client") of Agency, whom Respondent did not individually treat, have a history of civil discord with each other.
- Both Respondent and Client have in the past filed Injunctions of Harassment against each other.
- 5. Upon hire, Respondent signed acknowledgement of Agency policies, which included information on the following:
 - a. Unauthorized access to information or systems is prohibited.
 - b. Refrain from accessing information about individuals unless specifically authorized and required as part of assigned duties.
 - c. Access sensitive information only when it is necessary to perform job functions.
- 6. Despite Agency's policies, Respondent acknowledges inappropriately accessing Client's electronic health record.
 - 7. According to Respondent's 04/22/19 Termination Letter from Agency:
 - a. On 03/02/18, Respondent electronically accessed patient health information in a manner that was not associated with her duties.
 - b. Upon further investigation, it was determined that Respondent electronically accessed PHI of two other patients on separate occasions in a manner not associated with her duties.

8. In conclusion:

- Respondent disregarded several Agency policies regarding the protection and unauthorized access of patient health information.
- b. Respondent inappropriately accessed the protected health information of a patient whom she had a long history of civil discord with.
- c. Respondent also accessed that patient's daughter's electronic health record as well as two other individuals.
- d. By accessing electronic health records, Respondent had access to information including diagnoses, reasons for treatment, and other protected and confidential information, to which those patient's had an expectation of privacy.
- 9. As a corrective action, Respondent completed 8 continuing education hours surrounding ethics and HIPAA privacy rules.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3251 et seq. and the rules promulgated by the Board relating to Respondent's professional practice as a licensed behavioral health professional.
- 2. The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute a violation of A.R.S. § 32-3251(16)(k), any conduct or practice that is contrary to recognized standards of ethics in the behavioral health profession, as it relates to the NASW Code of Ethics:

1.07, Privacy and Confidentiality:

(a) Social workers should respect clients' right to privacy. Social workers should not solicit private information from or about clients except for compelling professional reasons. Once private information

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is shared, standards of confidentiality apply.

(q) Social workers should avoid searching or gathering client information electronically unless there are compelling professional reasons, and when appropriate, with the client's informed consent.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the parties agree to the provisions and penalties imposed as follows:

Stayed Revocation

- As of the effective date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent's license,
 LCSW-17004, shall be REVOKED for 24 months. However, the revocation shall be stayed and
 Respondent's license shall be placed on probation.
- 2. During the stayed revocation portion of the Order, if Respondent is noncompliant with the terms of the Order in any way, the stay of the revocation shall be lifted and Respondent's license shall be automatically revoked as set forth above.
- 3. If Respondent contests the lifting of the stay as it relates to this paragraph, Respondent shall request in writing, within 10 days of being notified of the automatic revocation of licensure, that the matter be placed on the Board agenda for the Board to review and determine if the automatic revocation of Respondent's license was supported by clear and convincing evidence.
- 4. If the written request is received within 10 days of a regularly scheduled Board meeting, the request will not be heard at that meeting, but will be heard at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting.
- 5. Pending the Board's review, Respondent's license shall be reported as revoked under review. Respondent may not work in any capacity as a licensed behavioral health

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Probation

professional pending the Board's review. The Board's decision and Order shall not be subject

- 6. Respondent's license, LCSW-17004, will be placed on probation for 24 months, effective from the date of entry as signed below.
- 7. Respondent shall not practice under their license, LCSW-17004, unless they are fully compliant with all terms and conditions in this Consent Agreement. If, for any reason, Respondent is unable to comply with the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement, they shall immediately notify the Board in writing and shall not practice under their license until they submit a written request to the Board to re-commence compliance with this Consent Agreement. All such requests shall be pre-approved by the Board Chair or designee.
- 8. In the event that Respondent is unable to comply with the terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement, all remaining time frames shall be tolled and remain tolled until such time as they are granted approval to re-commence compliance with the Consent Agreement.

Continuing Education

- 9. In addition to the continuing education requirements of A.R.S. § 32-3273, within 12 months of the effective date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent shall complete 6 clock hours of the NASW Staying Out of Trouble continuing education course or an equivalent course addressing current behavioral health documentation standards in Arizona. All required continuing education shall be pre-approved by the Board Chair or designee. Upon completion, Respondent shall submit a certificate of completion of the required continuing education.
- 10. In addition to the continuing education requirements of A.R.S. § 32-3273, within 12 months of the effective date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent shall take and pass a

three semester credit hour graduate level behavioral health ethics course from a regionally accredited college or university, pre-approved by the Board Chair or designee. Upon completion, Respondent shall submit to the Board an official transcript establishing completion of the required course.

Clinical Supervision

12. While on probation, Respondent shall submit to clinical supervision for 24 months by a masters or higher level behavioral health professional licensed by the Arizona Board of Behavioral Health Examiners at the independent level. Within 30 days of the date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent shall submit the name of a clinical supervisor for pre-approval by the Board Chair or designee. Also within 30 days of the date of this Consent Agreement, the clinical supervisor shall submit a letter disclosing their prior relationship to Respondent. In that letter, the clinical supervisor must address why they should be approved, acknowledge that they have reviewed the Consent Agreement and include the results of an initial assessment and a supervision plan regarding the proposed supervision of Respondent. The letter from the supervisor shall be submitted to the Board.

Focus and Frequency of Clinical Supervision

13. The focus of the supervision shall relate to ethics, documentation, responsibility, and Board rules and statutes. Respondent shall meet individually in person with the supervisor for a minimum of one hour weekly.

Reports

- 14. Once approved, the supervisor shall submit quarterly reports for review and approval by the Board Chair or designee. The quarterly reports shall include issues presented in this Consent Agreement that need to be reported and the supervisor shall notify the Board if more frequent supervision is needed. Quarterly reports shall include the following:
 - a. Dates of each clinical supervision session.

- b. A comprehensive description of issues discussed during supervision sessions.
- 15. All quarterly supervision reports shall include a copy of clinical supervision documentation maintained for that quarter. All clinical supervision documentation maintained by the supervisor shall comply with requirements set forth in A.A.C. R4-6-212(C).
- 16. After Respondent's probationary period, the supervisor shall submit a final summary report for review and approval by the Board Chair or designee. The final report shall also contain a recommendation as to whether the Respondent should be released from this Consent Agreement.

Change of Clinical Supervisor During Probation

17. If, during the period of Respondent's probation, the clinical supervisor determines that they cannot continue as the clinical supervisor, they shall notify the Board within 10 days of the end of supervision and provide the Board with an interim final report. Respondent shall advise the Board Chair or designee within 30 days of cessation of clinical supervision by the approved clinical supervisor and provide the name of a new proposed clinical supervisor. The proposed clinical supervisor shall provide the same documentation to the Board as was required of the initial clinical supervisor.

Therapy

18. During the period of probation, Respondent shall attend therapy for 12 months with a masters or higher level behavioral health professional licensed at the independent level. Within 30 days of the date of this Consent Agreement, Respondent shall submit the name of their therapist and the therapist's curriculum vitae for pre-approval by the Board Chair or designee. Also within 30 days of the date of this Consent Agreement, the therapist shall submit a letter addressing why they should be approved, acknowledging that they have reviewed the

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Consent Agreement and include the results of an initial assessment and a treatment plan regarding the proposed treatment of Respondent.

19. Upon approval, the Board will provide the therapist with copies of any required evaluations completed at the request of the Board prior to this Consent Agreement and the Board's investigative report.

Focus and Frequency of Therapy

20. The focus of the therapy shall relate to emotion regulation, high conflict management, self-care, boundaries, and distress. Respondent shall meet in person with the therapist twice monthly.

<u>Reports</u>

21. Once approved, the therapist shall submit quarterly reports and a final summary report to the Board for review and approval. The quarterly reports shall include issues presented in this Consent Agreement that need to be reported and the therapist shall notify the Board if more frequent therapy is needed. The reports shall address Respondent's current mental health status, medications prescribed, if any, treatment recommendation, and shall report if, in their professional opinion, Respondent becomes unable to practice psychotherapy safely and competently. The final report shall also contain a recommendation as to whether the Respondent should be released from this Consent Agreement.

Change of Therapist

22. In the event that, during the period of Respondent's probation, Respondent's Board-approved therapist discontinues treatment, Respondent shall submit the name of a new therapist and the therapist's curriculum vitae for pre-approval by the Board Chair or designee within 30 days of the discontinued treatment. Also within 30 days of the date of the discontinued treatment, the proposed therapist shall submit a letter addressing why they should be approved,

acknowledging that they have reviewed the Consent Agreement, and include the results of an initial assessment and a treatment plan regarding the proposed treatment of Respondent.

Civil Penalty

23. The Board imposes a civil penalty against Respondent. Within 6 months of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit a certified check or money order payable to the Arizona Board of Behavioral Health Examiners in the amount of \$1000.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Provision of Clinical Supervision

- 24. Respondent shall not provide clinical supervision while subject to this Consent Agreement.
- 25. The Board reserves the right to take further disciplinary action against Respondent for noncompliance with this Consent Agreement after affording Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard. If a complaint is filed against Respondent for failure to comply with this Consent Agreement, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.
- 26. If Respondent currently sees clients in their own private practice, and obtains any other type of behavioral health position, either as an employee or independent contractor, where they provide behavioral health services to clients of another individual or agency, they shall comply with requirements set forth in paragraphs 27 through 29 below.
- 27. Within 10 days of the effective date of this Order, if Respondent is working in a position where Respondent provides any type of behavioral health related services or works in a setting where any type of behavioral health, health care, or social services are provided, Respondent shall provide the Board Chair or designee with a signed statement from Respondent's employer(s) confirming Respondent provided the employer(s) with a copy of this Consent Agreement. If Respondent does not provide the employer's statement to the Board

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within 10 days of the effective date, the Board will provide Respondent's employer(s) with a copy of the Consent Agreement.

- 28. If Respondent is not employed as of the effective date of this Order, within 10 days of accepting employment in a position where Respondent provides any type of behavioral health related services or in a setting where any type of behavioral health, health care, or social services are provided, Respondent shall provide the Board Chair or designee with a written statement providing the contact information of their new employer and a signed statement from Respondent's new employer confirming Respondent provided the employer with a copy of this Consent Agreement. If Respondent does not provide the employer's statement to the Board within 10 days, as required, Respondent's failure to provide the required statement to the Board shall be deemed a violation of A.R.S. § 32-3251(16)(n) and the Board will provide Respondent's employer(s) with a copy of the Consent Agreement.
- 29. If, during the period of Respondent's probation, Respondent changes employment, resigns, is involuntarily terminated, resigns in lieu of termination, or goes on extended leave of absence for whatever reason that may impact their ability to timely comply with the terms of probation, Respondent shall, within 10 days of the aforementioned acts, inform the Board of their change of employment status. After the change and within 10 days of accepting employment in a position where Respondent provides any type of behavioral health related services or in a setting where any type of behavioral health, health care, or social services are provided, Respondent shall provide the Board Chair or designee a written statement providing the contact information of their new employer(s) and a signed statement from Respondent's new employer(s) confirming Respondent provided the employer(s) with a copy of this Consent Agreement. If Respondent does not provide the required statement to the Board within 10 days, as required, Respondent's failure to provide the required statement to

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the Board shall be deemed a violation of A.R.S. § 32-3251(16)(n) and the Board will provide Respondent's employer(s) with a copy of the Consent Agreement.

- 30. Respondent shall practice behavioral health using the name under which they are licensed. If Respondent changes their name, they shall advise the Board of the name change as prescribed under the Board's regulations and rules.
- 31. Prior to the release of Respondent from probation, Respondent must submit a written request to the Board for release from the terms of this Consent Agreement at least 30 days prior to the date they would like to have this matter appear before the Board. Respondent may appear before the Board, either in person or telephonically. Respondent must provide evidence that they have successfully satisfied all terms and conditions in this Consent Agreement. The Board has the sole discretion to determine whether all terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement have been met and whether Respondent has adequately demonstrated that they have addressed the issues contained in this Consent Agreement. In the event that the Board determines that any or all terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement have not been met, the Board may conduct such further proceedings as it determines are appropriate to address those matters.
- 32. Respondent shall bear all costs relating to probation terms required in this Consent Agreement.
- 33. Respondent shall be responsible for ensuring that all documentation required in this Consent Agreement is provided to the Board in a timely manner.
 - 34. This Consent Agreement shall be effective on the date of entry below.
- 35. This Consent Agreement is conclusive evidence of the matters described herein and may be considered by the Board in determining appropriate sanctions in the event a subsequent violation occurs.
